Who Are Eligible?

Graduation Seniors who are looking to continue their education beyond high school at a four-year college, a two-year college, vocational technical school or business

What's Included in the Scholarship?

The club will give two \$1,000 scholarships.

Scholarship Requirements

- 1. Scholarships will be awarded to graduating high school seniors based on the following criteria:
 - a. Candidates must be active in at least one civic organization within their high school.
 - b. Candidates must have at least a 3.0 GPA and be in good standing with their high school.
 - c. Candidates must plan to attend an institution of higher learning within the United States.
 - d.Candidates must plan to enroll as a full-time student and pursue a two, four, or five year degree.
- 2. Scholarships will be awarded only to those classified as graduating high school seniors.
- Scholarships will be in the form of funds to cover tuition, books and related course supplies.
- 4. All scholarship monies will be paid directly to the institution of higher learning at which the recipient enrolls.

- 2. Page 1 Title page with the heading "The Woodlands/South Montgomery County Kiwanis Charities Scholarship Application." Include your name, address, phone number and e-mail.
- 3. Page 2 Blank sheet of paper with a recent photograph attached in the center with name underneath.

- 4. Page 3 A typed essay of approximately 250 words answering one of the three following questions.

 Please indicate which question you are answering:
- If you had one hour to talk to one famous person alive today in politics, sports, religion or the arts and entertainment, who would you select to talk to and what would you talk about or tell them?
- Tell us about a person or event that has significantly influenced or changed your life.
 How does that person or event affect how you live your life today?
- If every young adult was required to give two years of service to society after college what type of service would you choose and why?
- 5. Pages 4-8, the Application.
- 6. Pages 9, 10, and 11 Three letters of reference: one from your civic club sponsor, one from a teacher or guidance counselor, and one from a source outside the high school system.
- 7. If you have received any press coverage or have had any articles published throughout your high school career, include them after page 11.
